










On June 1, they entered as the #5 seed in the inaugural Michigan Girls High School Flag State Championship at Ford Field where they made it to the Final Four!



We are parents and community members who provide supplemental financial support for all LCN athletic programs. Everyone is encouraged to become a member and join in our efforts to support our athletes.




