Bylaw Proposed Updates

New Committees

Section 1 – All paid Music Booster members are eligible to chair committees. The President shall appoint, considering recommendations made by the immediately previous committee chairpersons, the chairpersons of the following committees within two months following the President's election:

- Marching Band Banquet
- Band Festival
- Bylaws
- Chaperones
- Equipment Management
- Hoagie Sales
- Musical Support

Bylaw Proposed Updates

Audit Frequency and Annual Committee removal

The Auditor serves at the discretion of the Executive Committee with a term not to exceed more than three consecutive years.

The Auditor of the organization will perform an audit one time at the end of the fiscal year . and also at the close of the Treasurer's term of office.

Section 2 – Prior to the last meeting of the year, the chairperson of each committee shall submit to the president a written summary of the year's work of his or her committee and a written inventory of the committee's Booster-owned assets with recommendations for the next year.

Section 3 – For any committee that maintains activity throughout the year including the summer months (hereto referred as "Annual Committees"), the chairpersons of said committee shall only chair or co-chair that committee.

The Annual Committees shall be:

- Equipment Management
- Performance Attire
- Spring Trip
- Ways and Means

Bylaw Proposed Updates

New Bethette Sub-Committee

Bethettes – Committee chairs are composed of the two head Bethette parents who are responsible for maintaining the appearance, quality, and consistency of the Bethette performance uniform. The committee will oversee the selection, purchasing, organization, and the distribution of all uniform components to ensure every Bethette is properly equipped for performances throughout the season.

Scholarship Committee and Process

Section 16 – Scholarship

The Bethel Park Music Boosters may, but is not obligated to, present scholarships each spring to graduating seniors committed to attending a post high school educational institution.

The Scholarship Committee consisting of at least one Executive Board member (Secretary if not a senior parent) and one General member shall be formed in September. Parents of senior students are not eligible to join the scholarship committee. Should all Executive Board members be senior parents, then at least two General members will serve on the committee and the Executive Board will serve in an advisory capacity regarding financial decisions only.

- The committee will review and update the scholarship application and rubric as needed.
- The Scholarship Committee will collect the completed rubrics from the Review Committee, tally the scores and provide a list of the winners to all the officers and music directors.

The scholarship recipient(s) will be announced at the end of the year concerts and subsequently announced via electronic BPMB communication and on the BPMB website.

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- Scholarship money will be paid directly to the college.
 - Scholarships must be used during the school year following high school graduation.
 - Funds will only be provided after printed proof of commitment to attend is provided to the BPMB Board. (Such as a signed letter from the college, university, trade school or other institution.)

Review Committee

- A review Committee shall be appointed by the executive board officers.
- The committee shall consist of non-BPMB members.
- Scholarship applications shall be received in the BP Band room in the Scholarship Box. The Scholarship Committee will ensure that all applications are complete, names are removed, and all necessary information is forwarded to the officers. (President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer for the disbursement to the review committee) The Review Committee will send completed rubrics to the scholarship committee by pre-determined date.

Bylaw Proposed Updates

Dance, Alumni, and Spring Trip Committees

Section 17 – Dance Competition Concession Committee

The committee will run a concession stand at BPHS cafeteria for Dance competitions throughout the year.

Section 18 – Alumni Committee

The Committee Chair shall be a booster/music program alumni. Can be a current booster member if unable to find alumni to chair.

The committee chair will create a formal alumni network within the Bethel Park Music Boosters that reconnects former band, orchestra, chorus, marching band, musical, booster parents, and retired music directors. The purpose of this committee is to strengthen long-term alumni engagement, expand community support, and create new fundraising opportunities for the music program. This chair will be an alumni of the boosters and/or music program.

Section 19 – Spring Trip

The Committee Chair is the Vice President who will organize and plan the trip. The officers will assist the Vice President with chaperone selection in November/December and any other duties the Vice President requires for trip planning.

Bylaw Proposed Updates

Meeting Date Flexibility

Article VIII – Meetings

Section 1 – The regular general membership meetings shall be scheduled **on the third Tuesday of the month in three times a year during the months of** August/September, February, and April at 7:00 p.m., in a specified location at the Bethel Park High School. Parents are requested to attend all the meetings throughout the year. The August/September General Meeting is *mandatory* for all parents of the students who participate in Marching Band, Chamber Orchestra, String Orchestra, Symphonic Band, Concert Band, and Top 21 (all of the ensembles who participate on the Spring Trip). In addition, students who are going on the Spring Trip and at least one parent or guardian are required to attend the regular general membership meeting in April. The Executive Board may reschedule the general membership meetings if necessary.

Section 2 – The regular Executive board meetings shall be scheduled **on the second Tuesday of** each month during the year, except June, July, and December. Executive Board meetings may be scheduled or rescheduled by the President.

Section 3 – The President may call special meetings of the general membership or executive board.

The hoagie philosophy is a simple one, **one for all and all for one.**

Band, Orchestra, and Choir students work together to sell, make, and deliver a fresh, top quality product known as the Bethel Park Band Hoagie to realize a common goal for the entire organization. The Bethel Park Music Boosters have a long standing tradition of “Hoagie Sales” which has been well supported by the community of Bethel Park and surrounding areas for decades. The Music Boosters and Music Department are grateful for this support, and we work to make certain that the hoagies are of excellent quality.

Hoagie sales, assembly, and delivery have become a family tradition among Band, Orchestra, and Choir families because students, parents, and faculty become involved. Profits from hoagie sales are used to fund Music Department activities throughout the year. The annual Spring Trip for the Music Department students is one of the activities funded from hoagie sales. The type and extent of activities that occur on the Spring Trip are directly dependent on the success of the five hoagie sales for the year.

Types of Hoagies

Italian- bologna, ham, salami, cheese; lettuce & tomato on the side

Turkey- turkey & cheese; lettuce & tomato on the side

Mission- customer pays for a hoagie, but it is donated to one of five local missions; we make an Italian hoagie so that it can be frozen

* Washington City Mission, 8th Avenue Mission, Narrow Gate Missions, Light of Life Mission, Bethel/St. Clair Meals on Wheels, Finleyville Food Bank

*One bag of lettuce and 2 tomatoes is provided for every 5 italian or turkey hoagies sold; students are responsible for repackaging and dividing for customers

SELLING & DELIVERY TIPS



- Primary Customers: Family, friends, and neighbors in and around Bethel Park. Keep and maintain your customer list year after year—never throw it away! Ask graduating seniors for their contact lists.
- Local Businesses: Workers at local businesses love having fresh lunch delivered on a Saturday shift.
- Social Media & Tools: Utilize social media to reach buyers. Use route delivery apps on sale morning to save time and gas.
- Delivery Guidelines: Deliver all hoagies by lunchtime on sale day. Keep customer contact details on hand. Consider leaving a thank-you note with your contact info and the date of the next sale. Pre-arrange cooler drop-offs with cash if customers are not home. Just these points.
